Medicals: The LMCD Deputy responded to 11 medicals over the summer period including:

- Neck injury from dive accident off boat – C-Spine and neck braced victim – Transported to paramedics and hospital
- Broken femur from fall off boat – Transported by boat to boat access – Medics transported to hospital
- Severe Seizure – Transported to APSD – Paramedics transported to hospital
- Dislocated shoulder – Transported to APSD – Medics transported to hospital
- Allergic reaction – Transported to Arcola Public Safety dock (APSD) to paramedics – Evaluated and released
- Intoxicated party – Transported to APSD – Father picked up
- Intoxicated party – Transported to APSD – Placed in detox
- Cut shin – Transported to Arcola Public Safety dock to paramedics – Bandaged and released
- Allergic reaction to Bee Sting – Transported to paramedics – Evaluated and released
- Seizure – Transported to APSD – Medics transported to hospital
- Dehydrated party – Transported to APSD – Paramedics initiated IV's

Miscellaneous Incidents:

- Worked two undercover underage consumption drinking details
- Searched for nine overdue boaters and/or missing people – All safely located
- Responded to six loud music complaints
- Responded to fifteen stalled watercraft and provided tow services
- Removed three hazards to navigation
- Provided safety and security for three fireworks details
- Assisted with wild black bear at Fletchers
- Responded to request from lake resident to stop at child's birthday party
- Removed two dead animals from lake
- Provided safety and security for Liberty on the Lake Concert with Tim McGraw
- Inspected numerous rental watercraft on Lake Minnetonka

Generated Incidents:

There were 117 generated incidents for Water Patrol from 0600 hours on July 4th to 0400 hours on July 5th.

- 84 TRS
- 4 Alcohol related medicals
- 3 Bleed
- 1 Water Emergency (Possible near drowning 4 yr. old child – Elm Creek Park – Child ok and not transported to hospital)
- 25 Misc. (Stall, INFO, Loud Music, AST POL, Missing Person)

Medicals/Accidents:

- Adult male transported to hospital for alcohol intoxication
- Adult female transported to detox - .27 BAC – Unable to locate responsible party to drive home
- Adult male minor prop injury to leg. Transported to hospital for stitches
- Adult female with possible diabetic issue. Evaluated by paramedics and determined anxiety attack – Transported by HCSO to family members
- Juvenile male – Elm Creek Park – Lifeguard pulled struggling child from water – Evaluated by paramedics – Determined ok – Not transported to hospital

Enforcement Actions:

- Citations - 24
 - 8 Minor Consumptions
 - 16 for safety violations and quiet waters
- BUI's – 0
 - 84 traffic stops conducted by Water Patrol personnel.

Observations:

- Heavy late morning rain and threat of afternoon storms decreased the number of lake users from past years.
- Number of boaters at Big Island down but still significant amount of people
- Significant decrease in underage drinkers observed on the lake
- 84 traffic stops and no Boating under the Influence arrests. People utilizing sober operators
- Increase in people practicing courteous boating
